

Report of Meeting on July 23, 1931 (1)
July 23-1931, held in Miss
Christie's office at Chgo. Lying-in
Hospital, 5841 Maryland Ave.
Present: Mrs. K. Fairbank, Dr. W. L.
Adair, Dr. F. I. Luc Lean, Mr. J. C.
Dunsmore, Mrs. M. H. Langhorne,
Miss Kemper, Miss Christie, Dr. DeLee,
Mrs. Hirschl came in after meeting
had opened.

Mrs. F. asked Dr. DeLee for his report.
Dr. DeLee said he had tried to raise
money for the continuation of the
Maxwell Street Dispensary but had
met with very little success. People
were hardly interested in only relief.
Then Dr. DeLee developed the larger
program, the original plan of the Ch.
Lying-in Hospital and worked on the forma-
tion of an affiliation of the Dispensary

Ch. L. in Hosp. & the staff is to be united
to the Staff app'd by the U. of C. 9 Dr. D. C.
McLean suggested Dr. DeLee be named the
Chief of the Combined Staffs. Dr. DeLee ask'd
the assistance of Dr. Adair in this duty.

Mrs. Langhorne asked if the \$25,000 was
guaranteed for each year. Answered yes.
Dr. DeLee further stated that in the future
W. W. U. were to build a maternity hospital
similar to the new L-in, on the MacKenlock
campus & that this would be also under
the affiliation with W. W. U. Mrs. F. asked
if Dr. DeLee had committed her & her
Board to raise the money for this hospital.
Dr. DeLee said he could not & did not
commit the Board to anything of this kind,
but did commit them to accept such
a Hospital for the Chicago in Hosp. & Disp.
as a further development of the original
plan sponsored by Mrs. F. in 1908.

Dr. DeLee reminded Mrs. J. that in the public prints she had declared herself for the larger program - in fact, 3 hospitals & several additional Dispensaries.

There was some discussion of zoning the city for the assignment of cases, Dr. Quefau & Miss Christie suggesting that 47th St. be the dividing line between the Hosp. & the Maxwell Disp. Service. Dr. DeLee suggested that the intern & student nearest the home of the patient be sent - but did not insist on this - rather that this is a detail & can be arranged later.

Dr. Quefau said he had always been in favor of such an affiliation & could see many advantages. ~~He~~ ^{(Dr. Adair and} made the motion, seconded by ~~several~~ ^{several} voices that, Dr. DeLee's offer be accepted, ~~trapping to the Service Aug. 1st 1931~~, and that an affiliation with Northwestern be entered into to begin Aug. 1st. 1931
